National Schools Individual and Team Finals - April 2023

The National Schools Individual and Team Finals took place on Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd April at Aldersley Leisure Village, Wolverhampton. Warwickshire Schools had players taking part in every individual event, and the under 16 boys team finals.

Individual Championships

Under 11 Girls:

Charlotte Wong won group C, beating all four of her opponents with ease. Charlotte progressed to the quarter finals where she had a competitive battle with Violet-Lily Marquis (Bedfordshire) losing 2-3 (8-11, 9-11, 11-9, 11-6, 1-11).

Under 11 Boys:

This was Nokulus Lam's first National Competition, and it was great experience for him. Although Nokulus did not progress to the knockout stages from his group, he won several of his group matches and enjoyed his day.

<u>Under 13 Girls:</u>

Hazel Lam (who is still under 11) played in the under 13 girls' competition. Again, this was great experience for Hazel, including playing the number 1 seed Brooke Morris from Greater Manchester, who went on to win the title.

<u>Under 13 Boys:</u>

Aarif Li comfortably won his group, progressing to the knockout stages. He proceeded to beat Rowan Kumar 3-0, Jake Davidson 3-0, and then Adam Alibhai 11-6, 11-3, 14-12 in the semi-finals, to progress to play Pablo Ramirez Roija in the final (a repeat of the under 11 final from last year). The match was once again a very close encounter but Aarif came out on top this year winning 11-4, 10-12, 12-14, 11-5, 12-10 to become the under 13 boys' champion!

Under 16 Girls:

Esther Lam won her group with ease and progressed to the knockout stages. In the last 16, Esther beat Jyothirmayi Ghanta 3-1, followed by another 3-1 win against Zarita Lo. Esther then faced number 1 seed Tianer Yu, losing 0-3, but a great result to reach the semi-finals.

Under 16 Boys:

Despite being seeded number 2 in his group, Starry Sheung topped the group, beating Fred Jones 3-1, along with all the other group matches. Starry then faced Andrew Man (West Yorkshire) winning 3-1. In the quarter-finals, Starry played number 2 Cadet Isaac Kingham who was also the eventual winner of the under 16 boys, losing in straight sets.

Under 19 Girls:

Hanne Pui Yu Chui finished second in her group behind number 3 seed Erin Green (Nottingham). Hanne won her other four group matches. In the knockout stages, Hanne faced number 1 seed and Finnish International Aleksandra Titievskaja (who attends Grantham College in Lincolnshire), and despite the first set being 13-15, Hanne lost 0-3. Titievskaja went on to win the under 19 girls' title.

Mia Chan (despite only being under 16) also competed in the under 19 event, and although she did not progress out of her group, she gained some valuable playing experience in the competition.

Under 19 Boys:

Christopher Ho had a great performance in his group matches. Having won his first two matches against Thomas Nicol and Alex Gosling, Christopher faced number 2 seed Rhys Davies (Merseyside), to decide the group winner. Christopher played exceptionally well and was very unlucky to lose out 7-11, 11-8, 11-7, 3-11, 9-11. In the first round of the knockout stages, Christopher played Ching Jay Law, and lost in 4 sets.

Team Championships

Warwick School under 16 boys had battled through the County, Zonal, and Regional Team Competitions to reach the National Team Finals. The team comprised of Starry Sheung, Rex Wong, Toby John and Yannic Fowler.

In the finals, Warwick School played three other schools, starting with Reading School. The match finished as a winning draw to Warwick School, with two wins from Rex Wong, and one win from Starry Sheung and Toby John.
